My own devotion to the harp began when I received one from my aunt for my fifth birthday. As a child, my 'harpist' identity developed as my individuality meshed with the self-discipline and grit that my instrument demanded. Ultimately, the harp and my dedication to music fueled my commitment to excellence and capacity for hard work in anything I did.

At 13, I started studying with Elizabeth Hainen and volunteering for Lyra. Through my high school and Curtis careers, my envelope-stuffing developed into volunteering at our annual benefits.
